- III. **Treasurer Report** presented by Erik Lewis, there was one bill this month for portal annual maintenance and updates for \$1500 which leaves a remaining balance of \$4285.

- IV. Committee Reports
 - a. **Signing day** An update was given by Amy Lasack as this initiative has several partners: ICR Iowa is incorporating resources from Nate Kaeding and the Governors Future Ready Initiatives, students and the employers. The Future Ready Career Fair event will be spring board to the signing day event to promote the value of job offers and subsequent credentialing. More details to come.
 - b. **MS Increase Involvement** Tom Cavanagh and Brian Bedard: The Vernon MS pilot program will begin on January 29 and 31 is the Vernon MS classroom where students

will begin to understand manufacturing careers (using the portal) and design images that will eventually become a plaque (metal puzzle pieces with the Vernon MS logo and AMSB logo). The Kirkwood AutoCad students will then live stream with the Vernon MS students and provide feedback and begin converting the designs into AutoCAD and eventually into Solid Works. The designs will then be sent to Highway Equipment for the February 14th site visit for all students to see the design cut out and the finished product. The AMSB committee will then present the finished design and a video at Vernon MS parent teacher conferences. This pilot program is replicable for other schools in the future.
